Why the King James Bible?

The King James Bible was based on the correct line of manuscript New Testament Majority Text (Textus Receptus) and Old Testament Masoretic Text. It has also been compared with the previous Bible translations and revised to achieve a higher degree of accuracy and a formal correspondence to the original languages, the result being a perfect Bible text.

- Manuscript Base: The English King James Bible is compiled from the correct manuscript source, the Majority Text which geographically originated in Syria, Antioch comprises about 99% of the over 5,000 extant manuscripts in existence today. These manuscripts have a high degree of correspondence with each other unlike the Minority Text.
- Historical and geographical context: KJB based on, Majority text originates from Antioch, Syria, a place of positive Biblical significance and strong historical connection to the early Christian communities.
- Proven Bible Text: Since 1611, the King James Bible has proclaimed God's truth and is therefore both proven and preserved through over 400 years of faithful service, whose inerrant text has yielded unrivalled fruit to the Lord.
- Complete Bible text: The King James Bible preserves every word and verse, emphasising its completeness and reliability.
 - The KJB is the only Bible that exhorts us in 2Tim. 2:15 to STUDY by rightly dividing the word of truth. It still warns us about HELL, and SCIENCE falsely so called (1Tim. 6:20). It shows that GOD was manifested in the flesh in 1Tim. 3:15. It gives us the answer to the question of what hinders baptism in Acts 8:37. It reveals the name of the devil, Lucifer in Isa. 14:12 and it warns that MANY corrupt the word of God in 2 Cor. 2:17.
- Spiritual and theological purity: The KJB has had unchanged doctrine since 1611, unlike the forgeries on which modern Bibles are based (the Minority Text) whose translation changes are driven by economic and ideological motives rather than theological accuracy.

Choose the right Bible:

Choosing the right Bible is not just a matter of picking a book off a shelf; it is a deep matter of the heart concerning our attitude towards God's Word. For believers seeking authenticity and biblical credibility, the King James Bible (KJV) offers a clear and unambiguous link back to God's original revelation. With its roots firmly planted in the Majority Text, as well as its spiritual and historical background, the KJV serves as a bastion against the uncertainties and confusions often presented in modern Bible versions.

But aren't all Bibles the same? Not really, no. Although all Bibles contain God's truth, not all Bibles contain ALL truth. Each Bible is based on one of two main lines of manuscripts (N.T.): The Majority Text from Syria or the Minority Text from Egypt. The Minority Text relies on Codex Vaticanus and Sinaiticus, among others; these fraudulent manuscripts are the reason for the removal of many words and Bible verses. This is deeply problematic because it contradicts Biblical truths, such as that of Proverbs 30:5 which states that "every word of God is pure". God has promised to preserve his word.

"Thou shalt keep them, O Lord, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever. The wicked walk on every side, when the vilest men are exalted." - Psa 12:6-7. (KJV)

Yes, God has preserved His Word through the ages, and the King James Bible stands as a faithful guardian of the complete truth. Not only is this Bible the most widely distributed and read Bible globally, but its widespread use and permanence testifies to God's constant presence and protection over His Word.

The King James Bible creates faith, not doubt, and its text is inspired and breathed out by God; absolutely infallible. This is the preserved and living word of God: the Holy Bible.

Manuscript sources

The King James Bible is the most authentic representation of God's Word because of its unrivalled Biblical text, which is based on the N.T. Majority Text and the G.T. Masoretic Text. All Bibles are based on one of two manuscript sources: the Majority or Minority Text.

- The Majority text, the Textus Receptus, which is the basis of the KJV, originates geographically from Syria, from Antioch, and comprises about 99% of all extant manuscripts. These manuscripts were used by the translators of the KJV in 1611 and show a high degree of correspondence with each other. The Biblical tradition from Syria is positively highlighted in the scriptures, which strengthens its authority and reliability.
- The Minority Text, on the other hand, is based on a much smaller number of manuscripts (1%) originating from Egypt, Alexandria "the critical text" and disagreeing with each other in over 3000 places in the four Gospels alone (Matt, Mark, Luke, John) and is the basis for almost all modern. Bible translations incl. Westcott & Hort, Nestle-Aland (Novum Testamentum Graece) etc. All these Bible texts are corrupted and they have links to Catholicism which further questions their authenticity. The Biblical tradition from Egypt is negatively highlighted in the scriptures.

The so called "oldest and best" manuscripts e.g. Septuagint (LXX), Vaticanus and Sinaiticus which are constantly used as a basis to "correct" and attack the King James Bible, contain the apocrypha mixed with the canonical books of the Old Testament, (unlike the King James Bible 1611 which clearly separates the apocrypha from the Bible text, later the apocrypha was also removed completely from the KJB).

Most modern Bibles based on these so-called "oldest and best" manuscripts do NOT include the Apocrypha themselves, while defending the removal of both words and verses missing from these corrupt manuscripts that do contain the Apocrypha as part of Holy Scripture. The Hebrew Scriptures, entrusted by God to the Jews (Romans 3:1-2), never contained the Apocrypha. All this confirms the hypocrisy and undermines the credibility of these so-called "oldest" manuscripts and remember that an old forgery, is still a forgery.



Is your Bible missing words and whole Bible verses?

Most modern Bibles completely miss certain verses or show manipulatively altered words in the text e.g. in the KJB you can read "In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:" - Col. 1:14 (KJV). Compare this verse with other Bibles, where did the blood go? "through his blood" is removed.

- Mark 9:44: "Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched."
- 6. Mark 9:46: "Where their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched."
- 7. Mark 11:26: "But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses."
- 8. **Mark 15:28:** "And the scripture was fulfilled, which saith, And he was numbered with the transgressors."
- 9. **Luke 17:36:** "Two men shall be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left."

- 10. John 5:4: "For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had."
- 11. Acts 8:37: "And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God."
- 12. Acts 15:34: "Notwithstanding it pleased Silas to abide there still."
